I believe the small room you are referring to is currently being used by maintenance. We were storing items in the small closet just inside the exterior doorway, but since the electrical panel is in that closet, we had to move a lot of the items (specifically chemicals) that were being stored and that small room was the next best place. At that time, we couldn't find another storage area, but maybe it's something we can revisit as the moves begin to take place.

Dear Commissioners.

As we make plans to move to our new location we have questions about making facility changes. At the moment we do not see a need to change many things in the area we will be using for the office (where B&G Club has their offices currently). The only thing we may try to do is convert their kitchen into a bathroom but that is not a priority.

Our changes would be in the two larger activity areas where we will be creating a new kitchen/dining area.

The first question is...can we have the room that is in between the two activity areas? I believe it is currently being used for storage by some group/person. What we would like to do is create our actual cooking/kitchen area in that room, use the front room for dining/classroom activities and use the back room for food pantry/freezers, etc. IF we can have that room, we will need to have a contractor look at whether the walls are load bearing or if there are support beams. Also, are the walls simply dry wall or some type of brick/block. We propose to cut into the walls to make a pass through from the front "dining area" to the middle "kitchen" area to the back "storage area". It would be window size cuts, not full wall walk through.

We will need to access plumbing/water and run a 220 for the stove. We are looking at commercial grade gas stoves which will require running gas lines. This of course would be done by a licensed company, probably Blue Flame.

We will be working with a local contractor and volunteers to complete all work and are hoping to have most materials donated.

Last question, do we need a county/town building permit for any of the improvements?
