Highland Ridge Road to be Closed for Bridge Repairs

BURLINGTON, W.Va. – The West Virginia Division of Highways advises motorists that Highland Ridge Road (Morgan County Route 8) will be closed to through traffic on Monday, Jan. 20, to allow for bridge repairs to the existing Duckwall Truss Bridge.

The closure, which will only be in place for one day, is located just east of the intersection with Earl Weber Road (CR 26/1) and Spohrs Road (CR 8). A flagger will be in place to direct traffic. Local motorists can use Johnson's Mill Road (CR 26) during the road closure to get around the project; however, this route is not advisable for large trucks.
